



Division I Educational Document: Quiet Period Ban for Camp/Clinics

Proposal:

To prevent coaches from being involved with off-campus institutional camps/clinics and privately owned camps/clinics during quiet periods within the recruiting calendar

Rationale In Support of Proposal:

- A trend has become popular with coaches being involved with off-campus institutional camps/clinics and privately owned camps/clinics during the quiet period. It has also become an effective means of gaining exposure to a prospect or group of prospects at a time when off-campus recruitment is not allowed. NCAA Bylaw 13.12.1.3 details that recruitment is not permissible in these instances, however, it is widely believed that any participation in an off-campus camp/clinic is de facto recruitment for all prospects involved.

(Multiple agreements with the above statement.)

Rationale Opposed to Proposal:

- Eliminating this exception may prevent coaches who are looking to supplement their salaries from coaching with outside income.
