Proposed change: “June, July, August Restriction for Camp/Clinic”

To restrict the area, time period, and frequency of hosting institutional camps/clinics and participation in privately owned camps/clinics for departmental staff members with specific responsibility in the sport of volleyball as specified:

- Area
  - On an institution’s campus,
  - Within the states of the institution’s campus, or
  - Within a 50 miles radius of the institution’s campus, if the 50 miles radius extends into another state
- Time Period – Conducted in the months of June, July or August or any calendar week (Sunday through Saturday) that includes days of those months
- Frequency – Limited to two 15 consecutive day periods (on file in the Athletics Director’s Office)
- Participation in privately owned camps/clinics is limited to the two declared 15 day periods

Applicable NCAA Bylaw: 13.12.1.1.2 Football  
13.12.2.3.2 Other Non-Institutional Privately Owned  
Camps/Clinics – Sports other than Basketball

Rationale for change:

The exposure and familiarity afforded to the experience of working camps/clinics is a recruiting activity. Implementing a change of this magnitude will cease coaches from involving themselves in camp/clinic activity that is specifically manufactured to gain exposure with a prospect or group of prospects.

Rationale against change:

Eliminating this exception may prevent coaches who are looking to supplement their salaries from coaching with outside income.

Financial Implications: Minimal

Student Athlete Welfare Issues: Minimal

How does this align with other sports (or other NCAA divisions)?

Football already has the legislation proposed in effect.

### Operating Code Steps:



**Step One:** This form completed (Legislative Issue Form) and sent to HCC Chairperson. HCC Chairperson will pass along information to HCC reps.

Date completed and sent to HCC Chairperson: February 1

Date HCC Chair sent to HCC reps: February 6



**Step Two:** HCC reps send rationale (for or against) collected from conference coaches to the AVCA Office ([todd.hamilton@avca.org](mailto:todd.hamilton@avca.org)) This rationale will then be posted on the AVCA website and emailed to HCC Reps to be dispersed back to coaches for education and lobbying purposes.

This rationale should be sent by February 18<sup>th</sup>.



**Step Three:** HCC reps email PRELIMINARY votes (taken within their conference via email) to Todd at the AVCA office. A form will be provided to submit these votes. Remember, it is ONE VOTE PER SCHOOL for each Legislative Issues (majority is required to move forward)

Votes must be emailed to Todd by February 29<sup>th</sup>.



**Step Five:** 30 day comment period from Feb. 29<sup>th</sup> – March 28<sup>th</sup>. There can also be lobbying among coaches to help educate why schools voted the way they did.



**Step Six:** HCC reps email FINAL votes (taken within their conference via email) to Todd at the AVCA office. A form will be provided to submit these votes Remember, it is ONE VOTE PER SCHOOL for each Legislative Issues (2/3 vote

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in favor is needed for any action to take place on behalf of AVCA membership).  
Votes must be email to Todd by March 28<sup>th</sup>.
