Note from the AVCA

What we are witnessing with volleyball right now is phenomenal!

92,003 spectators for the University of Nebraska's Volleyball Day got the 2023-24 season off to roaring start in August taking the standard for our sport to heights that most of us could not have imagined the sport would reach.





According to the NCAA, throughout the women's season more than 30 Division I women's programs set attendance records with a reported 3.6 million total fans attending women's college volleyball matches in 2023. This wave also resulted in this being the most-viewed regular season, per ESPN which say on average 116,000 viewers for their regular-season broadcast on ESPN platforms.

The 2023 women's and girls indoor season could not have wrapped up on higher note, but it did! The NCAA D-I Women's Volleyball Championship in Tampa set an attendance record of 19,727 and an

average 1.7 million viewers tuned in to ABC on a Sunday afternoon – against NFL coverage – to watch the University of Texas sweep Nebraska to claim back-to-back national championships.

Right there along for the ride are our outstanding and dedicated volleyball officials!

The calendar has flipped to 2024 and we cannot wait to see how the boys, men's and beach disciplines continue to build on their tremendous momentum. With the increase in states that have sanctioned high school boys, bracket expansion for the National Collegiate Men including an automatic qualifier from the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC), and the next level of excitement for Women's Collegiate Beach as they crown a 2024 champion in Gulf Shores, Alabama before moving to Huntington Beach, California in 2025.

The AVCA is excited about cultivating the relationship with our officials and promoting volleyball officiating as an avocation. We can't wait to see what is next for our sport.

How Can You Engage? 4 STEPS

- CHOOSE A MATCH during the week of March 23 April 7. NOTE: Coaches/teams can participate in more than one match during the week. For example, you might choose to recognize officials at a Home match then work with another school to recognize officials at a match as the Visiting team. *If your team's schedule prevents you from participating during this period, contact tara.mcguire@avca.org for special arrangements.
- COORDINATE WITH THE OPPOSING COACH/TEAM to present a small token of appreciation goodie bag(s) or certificate of appreciation or something agreed upon prior to the match before the coin toss. Please include both coaches/teams in the presentation. You can also post signs or banners; for example, "Thank you to tonight's officials! We appreciate all you do for volleyball!" TO MAKE THIS A POSITIVE EXPERIENCE FOR ALL, PLEASE DO NOT PUBLISH NAMES OF OFFICIALS ON PROGRAMS, FLYERS, BANNERS OR SOCIAL MEDIA.
- TAKE PICTURES. The home team is responsible for pictures, though both teams may want to take photos to each share to social media. A photo that includes the officials, the coaches, and BOTH teams is highly recommended.
- POST 1-2 PICTURES TO SOCIAL MEDIA, and tag @AVCAVolleyball and #OFFICIATIONWEEK.

 NOTE: You may also want to tag your state volleyball coaches and/or officials association, and/or state athletic association.

Emphasis Sportsmanship

- Share posts from NFHS's benchbadbehavior.com to social media during #OFFICIATIONWEEK emphasizing good sportsmanship from athletes, coaches, parents and fans
- Donate a sportsmanship book or video to a local library on behalf of officials
- Invite your athletic director & coaches to discuss sportsmanship with athletes & parents

Goodie Bags

Present a goodie bag from both teams to officials. Goody bags can include snacks, gift cards to local establishments, team or school shirts, whistles, or anything else that represents your school

PA Announcement

Read a PA announcement before the game or during a break in play

- Sample PA script: "This week is the American Volleyball Coaches Association Boys, Men's & Beach Volleyball Officials Appreciation Week. We're asking fans, coaches and parents to join with us in honoring our officials for their time, dedication and selfless service to grow the sport of volleyball and the student-athletes who participate in it. Bad behavior by fans has led to a national shortage of officials. Set a positive example - bench bad behavior, think before you speak and always show respect to officials."

Thank You Notes

Provide written "thank you" notes from student-athletes to officials prior to a match

Video Message

Create an #OFFICIATIONWEEK video for social media and/or the video board during a match

2021-2024 #OFFICIATIONWEEK History

Now in its 4th year, #OFFICIATIONWEEK has become a proud annual tradition among hundreds of boys, girls, beach, men's and women's volleyball teams from 45 states plus D.C. 2024 marks the first official



beach volleyball #OFFICIATIONWEEK. The annual event is hosted by the AVCA High School Leadership Council. While the athletes, coaches and teams plan and lead the officials appreciation events, the national campaign's success is also credited to AVCA's Affiliate Program Partners; high school athletic associations; intercollegiate athletic conferences; public and private high schools and universities; and USA Volleyball Regions who encouraged their teams to participate.

2021 AVCA Volleyball Officials Appreciation Week

#OFFICIATIONWEEK was started by the AVCA in the fall of 2021, in response to the national shortage of high school volleyball officials. This 1st event was promoted to girls high school teams.

2022 AVCA Volleyball Officials Appreciation Week 241 Participants | 26 States

The 2nd Annual AVCA #OFFICIATIONWEEK held September 30, to October 8, grew vastly from the its first year to include 241 participants in 26 states. While the week was mainly marketed to girls volleyball teams, participants included girls, boys, beach and women's volleyball teams.


