Now, my goals include building a program that is successful year after year, that competes at the highest level in the state, and develops strong student-athletes. While a state championship is a goal of almost every coach, including me, in the end, my ultimate goal is for our program to be remembered for the character, commitment, and heart of our players.





Which coaches have influenced you the most?

My parents, Stefanie and Dave Otto, taught me a lot about being a coach and how to run a successful program. I learned so much about volleyball from my mom by watching her coach, playing for her in high school and coaching with her in 2018. I am still learning from them today as they are my JV coaches currently. My middle school basketball coach, Dennis Jackson, showed me how to care about people and support them in ways

beyond just the skill of the sport. My husband, Jim, who coaches girls basketball, has been so supportive and has given sound advice throughout my career. Finally, Lexi Algrim and Barry Burmeister at McHenry High School for taking a chance on me as a 19 year old, giving me the opportunity to start my coaching career at such a young age. I would not be the coach or person I am today without all of these wonderful people.

What do you enjoy most about your coaching job?

I love the relationships you get to build with your players and the growth you get to witness year after year. As a teacher at our school, I get to see these girls almost

everyday during the school year and most days in the summer. You see them at their best and at their worst (physically, mentally, and emotionally). You get to be there for them in those best and worst moments, too. You can really have an impact on their character development and growth. I love competition and winning, creating energy and encouraging the girls to support their dreams and believe in themselves. I love helping with recruiting, too. It's a cool process to be part of.
